

## Food Learning Locator Glossary

### Types of Sites on the Map

**Site:** A specific location on the map, marked by an icon that indicates the type of site. Types of sites include:

- **Food Education Program sites** (🍷): Programs focused on increasing participants' personal skills and knowledge of food-related topics
- **Job Training Program sites** (👤): Programs focused on building participants' professional skills and knowledge for food-related jobs and careers
- **Organizations** (🏠): Headquarters locations of organizations that 1) offer food education and job training programs or 2) provide related food research and resources

**Subcategory:** Focus areas within each site type. A single site can focus on more than one subcategory — for example, a food education site may focus on both cooking and growing food.

- **Food Education Program subcategories** (🍷)
  - **Making Healthy Food Choices:** Education related to nutrition, healthy foods and balanced eating
  - **Growing Food:** Programs that teach individuals how to grow and harvest food in nonprofessional settings, such as homes, schools and community gardens
  - **Shopping for Healthy Food/On a Budget:** Instruction on how to identify healthy products in stores, shop for healthy food on a budget, use food assistance benefits and more
  - **Cooking:** Culinary instruction for individuals looking to enhance their at-home cooking skills, recipe library or meal-preparation knowledge
- **Job Training Program subcategories** (👤)
  - **Integrating Food/Health in Classrooms:** Professional development for teachers, school staff and administrators related to integrating information on healthy food into schools, school gardens, and classroom environments
  - **Starting a Food Business:** Professional skill-building for individuals interested in launching food businesses, including food markets, food products and more
  - **Developing Culinary/Food Service Skills:** Culinary and food safety training for current/aspiring chefs, cooks, school cafeteria staff and other jobs in the food service industry
  - **Farming:** Training and apprenticeship opportunities for new/existing farmers in rural and/or urban agriculture
- **Organization subcategories** (🏠)
  - **Offering Food Education/Job Training:** Organizations that run on-the-ground programs for food-related education or training
  - **Providing Food Research/Resources:** Organizations that identify, collect, distribute and/or promote information to shape the body of research available on or government policies related to food education and/or training

### Other Terms

**Funders:** Philanthropists, foundations, government grant-making agencies, corporations and other entities that support programs and/or organizations running these programs.
